

Waiting for the True New Beginning

Another Roman New Year

n January 1, 2015, the old year slipped away and the clock of a new year began ticking. In reality, nature reminds us every year that the year does not end until the end of February, and the New Year starts with springtime in March. It is then that the birds make their nests, the caterpillars turn into butterflies, and the trees display new bouquets of flowers. Even the abbreviations of the months in the western world remind us that there has been a change in the numbering of the months. September is considered the 9th month, but the prefix "sept" means "seven." Likewise, October's prefix, "oct," means "eight;" November's prefix, "nov," means "nine;" and December's prefix, "dec," means ten. Hence, January and February would be the eleventh and twelfth months of the year.

Some have commented that Julius Caesar and Caesar Augustus both wanted to immortalize their names, so they took the seventh and eighth months of the year and named them after themselves—July and August. Both wanted to have 31 days in their month, so February lost two days.

The last day and the new beginning

Yet the real New Year is still to come. The Scriptures mention that when Jesus comes all things will change for our planet, its biosphere, and the human race. When He returns, He will make all things truly new. "And He that sat upon the throne said, Behold, I make all things new. And He said unto me, Write: for these words are true and faithful. And He said unto me, It is done. I am Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end." Revelation 21:5, 6.

Then, like Paul, we, too, can say as we anticipate this new year, "for now is our salvation nearer than when we believed." Romans 13:11.

In New York City, people gather at Time's Square and watch a digital ball fall down a large screen to ring in the New Year at midnight. New Year's hats, whistles, drinks, laughter, and good wishes are exchanged.

But now we must ask, How will the earth welcome the Lord Jesus when He comes? John, who wrote about the new heavens and the new earth, told what conditions would be like when He returns. "Behold, He cometh with clouds; and every eye shall see Him, and they also which

pierced Him: and all kindreds of the earth shall wail because of Him. Even so, Amen. I am Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the ending, saith the Lord, which is, and which was, and which is to come, the Almighty." Revelation 1:7, 8.

The world will lament and cry when the new dawn comes with Christ's second coming! Everyone will see the true beginning of the new age and the end of the old world order. They will look upon the Alpha and the Omega—the First and the Last of all creation—the Creator. They will see the One who was pierced so all would have the opportunity for a new beginning.

The Beginning and the End-aleph and tau

"They shall look upon Me *whom* they have pierced, and they shall mourn for Him, as one mourneth for His only Son, and shall be in bitterness for Him, as one that is in bitterness for his firstborn." Zechariah 12:10. Jewish rabbis debate over the word "whom" and over the phrase "whom they have pierced" in this text. Who is the "whom" who was "pierced" and for whom all shall "mourn" or lament with "bitterness"? Who is this "firstborn"?

The original Hebrew word in Zechariah 12:10 has only two letters, translated as "whom." Those two letters are the first and last letters of the Hebrew alphabet–aleph and tau. If the word were to be transliterated, it would be "az" in English or "alpha omega" in Greek. And who is the alpha and the omega, like the first and last letters of the alphabet, but Jesus Christ our Lord?

Zechariah brings home the thought and belief that each person is responsible for the death of Christ on Calvary. We have all pierced Him; but, like the thief on the cross, we too can plead with Jesus, "Remember me when Thou comest into Thy kingdom." Matthew 23:42. "For as in Adam all die, even so in Christ shall all be made alive." 1 Corinthians 15:22.

Through the prophet Zechariah, God foretold that Christ, the Messiah, would be sold for thirty pieces of silver (Zechariah 11:13) and be pierced on Calvary (Zechariah 12:10), would rise from the dead with eternal "wounds" in His "hands" (Zechariah 13:6) and return at His third coming with "all His saints" (Zechariah 14:5) to stand on the "Mount of Olives." Zechariah 14:4.

Some in Adventism today believe that prophecy has failed, that Jesus' standing on the Mount

of Olives at His third coming is a fallacy, and that the Spirit of prophecy is the result of mere "thought inspiration." Is this really so?

A New Year's resolution

When the New Year comes, it is a custom in America to make New Year's resolutions. People resolve to lose weight, save more money, pay off debts, get married, take their dream vacation, make peace with their neighbors and relatives, etc. It is a time to reflect and consider a new path. We also wish to make a New Year's resolution at the General Conference concerning *The Sabbath Watchman*.

In the coming months, through articles in *The Sabbath Watchman*, through regional symposiums planned in Asia, America, Europe, and Africa, this Reform Movement will reawaken the topic of the "Spirit of prophecy." The prophecies of the Old Testament will be reviewed and studied again in the light of their fulfillment in the life of Jesus the Messiah. The prophecies of Jesus will be reexamined, the apostolic fore-telling will be investigated, and it will be seen how the heavenly plans are being fulfilled in our day. And last, but not least, prophecies and statements found in the writings of Ellen G. White will be analyzed as to their trustworthiness and validity.

The silent period–a tarrying time before the New Year

The intertestamental period between the last prophets (Haggai, Zechariah, and Malachi) and John the Baptist was also a silent period. No major or minor prophets appeared in the holy land. No additional inspired scriptures were added to the Hebrew canon. There was a silence of 400 years.

Jewish scholars consider the time between the earliest writings in Hebrew, found among the Dead Sea Scrolls in the Qumran caves, and the Aleppo Codex, a Torah Scroll dating to the tenth century, as the silent period. There are no major complete Hebrew copies of the Old Testament between those two bookends. Scribes did copy the Scriptures faithfully during that time, but

those copies have apparently been lost. There was a 900-year period of silence.

Likewise, since the death of Ellen G. White on July 16, 1915, nearly 100 years ago, there has been a silent period of inspiration in Adventism. No other true messengers or prophets have come on the scene. It has become, as Jesus predicted, "a tarrying time" when the ten virgins all slumber. "While the bridegroom tarried, they all slumbered and slept. And at midnight there was a cry made, Behold, the bridegroom cometh; go ye out to meet him." Matthew 25:5, 6.


We are all, like the virgins, waiting for Jesus to come from the wedding and claim His bride, the church. We have all fallen asleep. He seems to have tarried in His return to earth, and we seem to be slumbering amid the affairs of this world. Just as the New Year is ushered in at midnight and the celebration begins, so it will be when Christ returns. And, as in the parable half of the virgins lamented and wailed because they had no oil to light their lamps, so today many are lamenting and will mourn because they have no spiritual eye salve to understand the word of God and the Spirit of prophecy. They receive no light from their earthen lamps, because they lack the unction of the Spirit of God.

A new silent period—a tarrying time—has come upon the world. Some seem to have a definite expectation of a new beginning, while the majority seem to slumber in unbelief, ignorance, and indifference.

Martin Luther asserted that there were only two days on his calendar–today and that day. Today is the day to repent, believe, and obey in preparation for that day. That day is the second coming of Jesus. May this New Year bring us all closer to Him. May the silence inspire us to learn from the past. May the tarrying time encourage us to share the gospel with others before it is forever too late to do so.

May the Lord extend His mercy and grace to everyone who loves Him. As did the faithful Bereans, let us study the prophecies regarding the Messiah's three comings as well as the lesser light of the Spirit of prophecy writings as we usher in the New Year. Let this be the Year of the Gift of Prophecy. SW

God is not well pleased when all the burden-bearing is done by a few members of the church, whose physical and spiritual powers are taxed to the utmost of their ability in their effort to counteract the influence of the worldly minded, halting, doubting ones. If those so lacking in piety and earnestness would seek to learn the lessons contained in God's Word, and would feel it their duty to practice these lessons, there would be more power in the church. Every member would seek to improve his talents. The light would not be hidden under a bushel, but placed on a candlestick, and its clear, steady rays would shine forth to dispel the darkness.

Are we looking forward to the latter rain, confidently hoping for a better day, when the church shall be endued with power from on high, and thus fitted for work? The latter rain will never refresh and invigorate the indolent, who do not use the powers God has given them. Is Christ always to be disappointed in the beings He has redeemed at an infinite cost?

The power of a higher, purer, nobler life is our great need. God's people are to be filled with holy joy, that its radiance may shine forth from them, brightening the pathway of others. The very first impulse of the renewed heart is to bring others also to the Saviour. Those who do not possess this desire give evidence that they have lost their first love; they should closely examine their own hearts in the light of God's word, and earnestly seek a fresh baptism of the Spirit of Christ; they should pray for a deeper comprehension of that wondrous love which Jesus manifested for us in leaving the realms of glory and coming to a fallen world to save the perishing....

seek constantly to do God's will, then they will work together in harmony. God's Spirit is one....

Our churches are not receiving the kind

of training that will lead them to walk in all humility of mind, to put away all pride of external display, and to labor for the inward adorning. The efficiency of the church is precisely what the zeal, purity, self-denial, and intelligent labor of the ministers make it. An active missionary spirit should characterize its individual members. They must have deeper piety, stronger faith, and broader views. They must make more thorough work in personal effort. What we need is a living religion. A single individual of enlarged conceptions of duty, whose soul is in communion with God and who is full of zeal for Christ, will exert a powerful influence for good. He drinks at no low, turbid, polluted stream, but from the pure, high waters at the fountainhead; and he can communicate a new spirit and power to the church. As the pressure from without increases, God would have His church vitalized by the sacred, solemn truths they believe. The Holy Spirit from heaven, working with the sons and daughters of God, will surmount obstacles and hold the vantage ground against the enemy. God has great victories in reserve for His truth-loving, commandment-keeping people. The fields are already whitening for the harvest. We have light, and rich, glorious endowments from heaven in the truth made ready to our hands; but men and women have not been educated and disciplined to work in the fast-ripening harvest fields. – Testimonies for the Church, vol. 5, pp. 385, 386, 479, 581.

Christlike activity pursued with persevering zeal will bring large returns. There will be an enlarged experience in love, and the human agents will have elevated views as to what God would do through them as they stand at their post of duty. Then will the church arise and shine, realizing that the glory of the Lord has risen upon her, and that darkness is receding.

Missionary success will be proportionate to whole-hearted, thoroughly consecrated effort. Every departure from true missionary effort, every failure to cherish the missionary spirit, has reacted upon the church, and there has been a decline of spirituality. This is one of the verses that attracted me to the Biblical faith, because I like freedom; after all, I grew up in a country where there was little freedom. It is interesting that when Jesus said these words, the Jewish people were offended and immediately retorted, "We be Abraham's seed, and were never in bondage to any man: how sayest Thou, Ye shall be made free?" John 8:33.

Jesus needed to repeat this principle in verse 36: "If the Son therefore shall make you free, ye shall be free indeed." Actually, any other freedom is only apparent freedom. Real, pure freedom comes exclusively from Jesus Christ. Longing for this freedom, many, many people have separated themselves from impure, unclean things.

"After a long and severe conflict, the faithful few decided to dissolve all union with the apostate church if she still refused to free herself from falsehood and idolatry. They saw that separation was an absolute necessity if they would obey the word of God. They dared not tolerate errors fatal to their own souls, and set an example which would imperil the faith of their children and children's children." –*The Great Controversy*, p. 45.

Through separation from error, the children of God obtained freedom. In fact, that freedom demanded that they be separated from error. Notice the three main points here.

(1) Separation took place amid tremendous conflict. (2) The believers could not stay where they were, because the word of God and His law in essence demanded a change. (3) They had to take such action, because what they did, good or bad, would have consequences for their children and their children's children and would also influence their friends and posterity.

Interestingly, when the Christian Jews had to separate from their roots, or when the Christian Gentiles had to separate from paganism, it was not enough for them to leave the synagogue or the organization they had been in. They had to separate from all of the traditions and customs that they were used to. Every one of us has a lot of traditions that we have adopted. Very possibly this is the case for me more than for all who read this article.

I remember my grandmother. She was very much in touch with tradition, and she taught us all kinds of big and little things that she said we needed to do every single day—for our good. It was similar in Old Testament times. Remember when Jacob was managing the flocks of Laban, his father-in-law. He wanted to produce cattle and goats with spots, because the two men had an agreement that all of the animals with spots would be Jacob's and all of those without spots would be Laban's.

Now, the Spirit of prophecy says that Jacob studied the laws of genetics, and he figured out how to produce more cattle with spots. But he also believed the traditions of that area, so he took green branches, cut the bark with a knife so it looked like spots, and put it in the animals' drinking water, believing the folklore of the area that this would make the animals give birth to spotted offspring. This is just one example of how a tradition affected the life of the people. But the apostles also struggled a lot with the traditions and customs with which they were surrounded.

When they heard the teachings of Christ, which touched many areas of their lives, they needed to make huge changes in their ways of thinking and doing. Imagine, for one, what it meant when Jesus taught that women and men are equal. That was a revolutionary idea. Even in the synagogue men and women sat in separate rooms. Jesus taught that servants and masters are equal. This was an incredible teaching, and the Christians were persecuted a lot for supporting such ideas.

"While they had been with Him, the disciples had often been perplexed by the teaching of the priests and Pharisees, but they had brought their perplexities to Jesus. He had set before them the truths of Scripture in contrast with tradition. Thus He had strengthened their confidence in God's word, and in a great measure had set them free from their fear of the rabbis and their bondage to tradition." –*The Desire of Ages*, p. 349.

Indeed, traditions can be a burden and even become slavery. Why? Because traditions are frequently connected to superstition. What does that mean? Well, supposedly if you do a certain thing in a particular way, you will have good luck; but if you do it in a different way, you will have bad luck. And this type of slavery under which people suffer is really terrible still today.

In the time of the apostles, there were some Christians who asserted that if a male was not circumcised as Moses prescribed, he could not be saved. You would lose your salvation. And this become very serious, because it had Scriptural support. This issue necessitated the first general conference at which the leaders gathered in Jerusalem and made a decision. But this was

not the only tradition that affected the lives of the apostles. The Jews held to many traditions at that time. Some were based on historical events. Others were borrowed from other nations. And this was not something unique just at that time; a huge collection of customs permeates every society and has continued down through the entire history of humanity.

I would sometimes ask my grandmother why I had to keep this or that tradition. She would always reply that it was because there was a good teaching behind it. Here is an example: If you put on your underclothes inside out, the tradition is that the whole day will be upside down for you. You will have no success in anything you try to do. If you have your socks on the wrong feet, there will be no good luck for you that day. I asked my grandmother, "How do you know which sock is the left and which is the right? They both look the same!" Well, it is interesting that my grandmother created different socks for the right and left feet when she knitted them. This is just a little example of what many people believe. When I began attending school, my grandmother threw water in front of my feet so I would have good luck; and I had to be careful to be sure a black cat did not cross my path. Well, that superstition is pretty international.

There are many traditions that seem to have some good meaning, but in reality they enslave people. In fact, those who pay a lot of attention to these kinds of traditions turn into real slaves. They are constantly on the outlook for especially trivialities—the colors of their clothes, the way they wear their clothes, how people look at them, and how people do not look at them. It is really, really terrible.

I remember the first time my wife visited Bulgaria with me. We went to see a fairly distant Orthodox relative of mine; and when she looked at my wife, she said, "Oh, ugly, ugly child!" Why did she say that? There is a tradition that if you see a beautiful child, you should never say, "Oh, what a beautiful child," because that would attract the attention of the evil spirits and something bad could happen to the child.

People are enslaved by such traditions. But the Lord says, "If you know the truth, if you know Jesus Christ, He will make you free." Through Jesus we are free indeed, because we are not saved by works! The apostle Paul preached this over and over again. We are saved by grace. Forget about all the big and small things. Forget even about the ceremonial law of the Old Testament. None of these things will save you. If you are circumcised as a religious imperative, you need to keep the rest of the law as well. Many people struggle with this concept.

But customs and traditions do not come just from superstitions. Often countries set up their own customs. For example, the country I come from celebrates a day of liberation. And because historically it was subjugated and enslaved a number of times, it has many days of liberation. History has changed because of the political system, so the result is that liberation from a fascist government has turned into slavery under a communist government. So what are we celebrating? This is all just an exchange of slave masters.

Some say that conditions were much better under the Germans than under the Russians, so the day of celebration is frequently connected with a lie. Along these lines, in 1990, some school boards in the United States came to the conclusion that there should be no more Christmas decorations and celebrations in public schools, because the boards contended that the separation of church and state had to be upheld. But when they did that, some parents rose up in protest and took the school boards to court for depriving the children of Christmas. What the court decided was pretty interesting. It ruled that Christmas is not a Christian feast and has nothing to do with religion; furthermore, what is not appropriate to do at Christmas is to read or mention anything that is in the Bible, for Christmas has nothing to do with the Bible and the Bible has nothing to do with Christmas. That was the interesting decision of a worldly court. But perhaps some will ask, How can they be so sure? Maybe we don't know exactly when Christ was born, but it is still good to celebrate the birth of Jesus.

An article was published in 1984 in a Buffalo, Ohio, newspaper about the origin of Christmas. It said that the earliest report of the celebration of Christmas was from the second century after Christ's birth. It is considered that the first Christmas celebration was actually a reaction to the Roman celebration marking the winter solstice—the return of the sun and honor for the planet Saturn as the god of the harvest. This is a terrible pagan feast.

In A.D. 529, Christmas became an official holiday because the emperor Justinian wrote an order that it had to be a feast. So, since that time it has been celebrated as a Catholic feast. The word itself is a combination of "Christ" and "mass." And the mass is a purely Catholic celebration that has nothing to do with the birth of Christ or even with primitive Christianity. So, it is quite interesting that a public court would conclude and rule, Don't mix the Bible and Christmas, because it has nothing to do with it. And don't confuse the kids. Sometimes the stones speak out.

We turn to a testimony that speaks about the importance of the pure gospel at the end of time. "The gospel is now opposed on every side. Never was the confederacy of evil stronger than at the present time. Spirits of evil are combining with human agencies to war against the commandments of God. Tradition and falsehood are exalted above the Scriptures; reason and science above revelation; human talent above the teaching of the Spirit; forms and ceremonies above the vital power of godliness. Grievous sins have separated the people from God. Infidelity is fast becoming fashionable." –Gospel Workers, p. 149.

This testimony is already dated-more than a hundred years old-because today evil has not become ALMOST fashionable; it is fashionable. It is incredible how much power evil has to distract people from the pure truth. And just as other traditions are related to superstition, Christmas is also related to superstitious beliefs. I remember the Christmas cake we had in my house when I was a child. My father would spin a big cake around in the middle of a large round table, because things were hidden in the cake. Everyone would begin eating the cake wherever it stopped in front of him. One person might find a small branch of a tree, and that meant he would have good luck in some area or other in the coming year. Someone else would find

something else, and he was supposed to have good luck in some other thing the next year, and so it would go around the room.

In England, a famous author wrote a now-famous Christmas story about a Jew who was not buying gifts for Christmas because he was so stingy, and he went to hell because of that. But that was actually just shown him in a dream; and when he woke up, he bought presents for the whole city. The message of the story? If you don't celebrate Christmas, you will go to hell. There are many similar festive connections in this world.

One thing is clear: There is a formula, a principle, behind all these celebrations, especially if God's name is attached to them.

The occasion is very attractive, because it is a wonderful thing, a celebration. No one has to go to work; there will be special food, and maybe there will also be some music. Oh, that will make it wonderful! It carries God's name, so it has a good purpose.

There is just one thing missing: It doesn't come from God. The Lord has not told anyone to participate in such celebrations. They are not in the Scriptures. But once such a custom takes hold, it becomes a tradition.

In my house, we have our own traditions. We have worship every morning; and after we pray, we have a family hug. It is my tradition. I don't know if you do this, but we do it; and this tradition is established. When someone is missing, it is just not the same.


Everything we do has an influence on our children, and that influence will be passed down

to the children of our children. That's why *The Great Controversy* says, "The faithful few decided ... that separation was an absolute necessity if they would" enjoy the freedom which Christ had granted them. "Stand fast therefore in the liberty wherewith Christ hath made us free, and be not entangled again with the yoke of bondage." Galatians 5:1.

In the same way that the emperor Justinian issued the law establishing Christmas, two hundred years earlier the emperor Constantine had issued a law establishing Sunday worship. So you see, there is not much difference between the two. And if one thing is not a big deal to celebrate, why should the other not be considered the same way? Of course, the Sunday law is a direct violation of one of the Ten Commandments



hat Peter understood this promise to cover the Lord's working to the end of time is set forth in these words: "Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost. For the promise is unto you, and to your children, and to all that are afar off, even as many as the Lord our God shall call." Acts 2:38, 39. Then as long as the Lord calls people to His service, so long is the promise of the Holy Spirit extended to them.

Paul, in writing to the Corinthians, says, "The manifestation of the Spirit is given to every man to profit withal." 1 Corinthians 12:7. The man-

Men, in their fallen state, are infirm, "being alienated from the life of God through the ignorance that is in them, because of the blindness of their heart." Ephesians 4:18. "Alienated and enemies in your mind by wicked works." Colossians 1:21. There "are given unto us exceeding great and precious promises; that by these ye might be partakers of the divine nature." 2 Peter 1:4. After yielding to God and becoming partakers of the divine nature, we are recognized as "the sons of God," being "led by the Spirit of God." Romans 8:14. That Spirit dwelling in us quickens (gives life—even the life of God—to) our mortal bodies. Romans 8:11. It then "beareth witness with our spirit, that we are the children of God," and seals us as His. Romans 8:16; 2 Corinthians 1:22. Then the righteousness of the law is fulfilled in us, "who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit." Romans 8:4.

The temple of the Spirit

The church of Christ on earth is really a place prepared for the indwelling of the Spirit. The apostle says, "Know ye not that ye are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwelleth in you?" 1 Corinthians 3:16. To the individual members of the church He says, "What? know ye not that your body is the temple of the Holy Ghost which is in you, which ye have of God, and ye are not your own?" 1 Corinthians 6:19. Again, "Ye are the temple of the living God; as God hath said, I will dwell in them, and walk in them." 2 Corinthians 6:16. And once more, "In whom all the building fitly framed together groweth unto an holy temple in the Lord; in whom ye also are builded together for an habitation of God through the Spirit." Ephesians 2:21, 22. Standing thus, we are "strengthened with might by His Spirit in the inner man." Ephesians 3:16. "Strengthened with all might, according to His glorious power, unto all patience and long-suffering with joyfulness." Colossians 1:11. Thus we may labor, "striving according to His working, which worketh in me mightily." Colossians 1:29.

Instead of simply coveting some particular gift for ourselves, it is better to seek entire consecration to the Lord-to have His love in our hearts.

Manifestation of the Spirit

In Paul's first epistle to the Corinthians he thus speaks of the work of the Spirit, saying: "The manifestation of the Spirit is given to every man to profit withal. For to one is given by the Spirit the word of wisdom; to another the word of knowledge by the same Spirit; to another faith by the same Spirit; to another the gifts of healing by the same Spirit; to another the working of miracles; to another prophecy; to another discerning of spirits; to another divers kinds of tongues; to another the interpretation of tongues; but all these worketh that one and the selfsame Spirit, dividing to every man severally as He will." 1 Corinthians 12:7-11. Those manifestations are all by one and the selfsame Spirit. How unlike the communications of spiritualism, which are from a variety of spirits, many of them being lying spirits!

The Spirit of prophecy

Paul proceeds in his discourse by comparing the church with the human body, representing the gifts of the Spirit as members of the body, the eyes, ears, hands, etc., saying: "Now hath God set the members every one of them in the body, as it hath pleased Him.... And God hath set some in the church, first apostles, secondarily prophets, thirdly teachers, after that miracles, then gifts of healings, helps, governments, diversities of tongues. Are all apostles? are all prophets? are all teachers? are all workers of miracles? have all the gifts of healing? do all speak with tongues? do all interpret? But covet earnestly the best gifts: and yet show I unto you a more excellent way." 1 Corinthians 12:18-31. We here read of the Lord's setting these gifts "in the church;" do we read elsewhere of His setting them out of the church?

Charity, or love

The more excellent way is not to have a church without the gifts of the Spirit; it is a more excellent way than simply to "covet" gifts. That "more excellent way" is fully set forth in 1 Corinthians, chapter 13, in the apostle's discourse on charity-fervent love to God, and to our fellowmen. Instead of simply coveting some particular gift for ourselves, it is better to seek entire consecration to the Lord-to have His love in our hearts-to "follow after charity, and desire spiritual gifts, but rather that ye may prophesy." 1 Corinthians 14:1. However, this discourse on charity does not dispense with the gifts of the Spirit. We read: "Charity never faileth: but whether there be prophecies, they shall fail; whether there be tongues, they shall cease; whether there be knowledge, it shall vanish away. For we know in part, and we prophesy in part. But when that which is perfect is come, then that which is in part shall be done away." 1 Corinthians 3:8-10. By this it is understood that the gift of prophecy may be manifest, as it may please the Lord, until the perfect state shall come. In that state, when the Lord is seen face to face, prophecy will no more be needed. "Now we see through a glass, darkly; but then face to face; now I know in part; but then shall I know even as also I am known." 1 Corinthians 13:12. **sw**

Let Jesus Be Your Harbor Pilot

In 2013 I spent my summer vacation on Sardinia, an Italian island in the Mediterranean Sea. First we drove to the port of Genoa, and from there we took the night ferry to the port of Olbia. Instead of spending the night in a cabin, we preferred sleeping on deck. While I was lying there wrapped up in my sleeping bag, I looked up at the starry night and listened to the sound of the waves and the strong breeze. My thoughts went back to Jesus on the Sea of Galilee.

He had lain down in the back of the boat, on the low bench where the steersman sometimes took rest. He must have been exhausted! So much was demanded of Jesus, it is not surprising that, when He eventually got a moment to rest, He would fall into a very deep sleep. The disciples were sailing happily across the lake when a storm whipped up out of nowhere. They were scared for their lives. They thought they were about to sink. And, in the midst of all the problems, Jesus was asleep in the back of the boat. Once He was aroused and got up and spoke to the wind, it died down. A great calm came upon the waters.

There are times in our lives when we feel at the mercy of the storm, when we feel as if our lives are as chaotic as the buffeting ocean. It might be a financial crisis, an illness, the loss of a beloved person. And although we pray and pray and pray, it is as if Jesus is asleep. It seems that He doesn't hear, no matter how loud we cry.

Back to my trip: The next morning, I woke up early and saw a wonderful sunrise. From far away I was able to see our destination, the green coastline and the harbor of Olbia. All of a sudden, I noticed a little boat coming from the harbor in our direction, and I was curious about what was going to happen. The little craft came as close as possible to our ferry, and I saw a man grab a rope ladder and climb up. I found out


that this was the harbor pilot. He is a boat pilot with specialized knowledge of the harbor. His work consists of directing large ships safely into a port by staying in special deep water channels that are between shallower flats. Without his services there would be a real risk of a ship's running aground, with damage to the ship itself as well as danger to the personnel, passengers, and cargo. The harbor pilot is on call around the clock, every day.

This made me think how Jesus also wants to be our harbor pilot. He is very familiar with the currents and shallow banks of our lives and knows the best way to travel safely. "He understands every circumstance of our life. He sees and knows how we are situated. He is acquainted with all our sorrows and griefs. He knows us each by name, and is touched with the feeling of our infirmities; for He has been tempted in all points like as we are, and knows how to succor those who are tempted. Jesus is our helper, and He will have a care for all those who trust in Him." —Review and Herald, August 25, 1885.

He doesn't want anyone to run aground on the shore like the cruise ship *Costa Concordia* did in January 2012 when it was brought too close to the rocks of an island. His promise in Isaiah 43:1, 2, *New International Version*, is still valid for each of us today: "Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have summoned you by name; you are Mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and when you pass through the rivers, they will not sweep over you." When we fully trust Him, he will guide our ship safely into port. "They were glad when it [the storm] grew calm, and He guided them to their desired haven." Psalm 107:30, *NIV*.

In your life, Jesus wants to be the harbor pilot who helps you bring your ship to your heavenly destination. **SW**

underestimate ourselves, as also often happens. What to do, then? Seek God so He will examine our hearts and show us what our true condition is, as the Bible teaches us. Psalm 139:23, 24. Only

when God guides us by His Holy Spirit can we

understand what our spiritual condition is.

But whether we have progressed, stagnated, or regressed in our life of faith, it is clear that we must not lose sight of one thing: We are called continually to put forth effort to have our characters transformed by God. We still have the opportunity to seek God and be molded by Him until our hard hearts are broken and surrendered to His divine love. So, we have a golden opportunity in this new year to achieve this. Let us not center our thoughts on what we did not do, on our failures, on our unfulfilled promises, or on our frustrations and defeats; rather, let us look to Christ and allow Him to continue His work as the divine goldsmith in our hearts. If we give Him every possibility to do this, He has promised His Spirit to carry out this work that it is not possible for one to do alone.

Yes, dear reader, the gospel of Jesus Christ has power to transform lives. 1 Corinthians 1:18. Undoubtedly, this is the most important challenge of human existence. Unfortunately the world focuses all its efforts on goals that have little or nothing to do with the pursuit of a Christlike character. Jesus assured His disciples, and with them all of us who may receive that power, "Ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you." Acts 1:8. The Greek word for "power" in this text is *dunamis*, meaning "ability" or "strength." The term "dynamite" comes from dunamis, designating an extremely explosive force capable of making a mountain disappear and change the topography of the land.

The only power capable of transforming a human life is God, who works through His Spirit in the heart of the individual, making him a new creature. 2 Corinthians 5:17. This was the experience of Paul, the persecutor of Christians, who was persecuted by his former Jewish brethren because of the change that took place in his heart. It was also the experience of John. When he met Christ, his character left much to be desired. Jesus did not choose this young man because he was ideal for the work that would be given him but because the Saviour wanted to transform his heart to do that work. So it is with us. God draws us to Him not by virtue of our capabilities and fitness but in spite of our shortcomings, because He loves us.

John met Jesus

John was a Galilean by birth, the son of Zebedee and Salome. Mark 15:40. He had a brother named James. Matthew 4:21. Zebedee and his two sons were fishermen. They were used to pushing out into the sea and thus earning their livelihood. John had accepted the good news of the gospel through the preaching of John the Baptist. John 1:35-40. When Jesus began His public ministry, John and Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, were the first disciples to accept Him as the Messiah. John followed Christ permanently when He began His ministry in Galilee. Jesus called him directly, along with his brother James, Peter, and Andrew. Luke 5:1-11.

Jesus wants everyone to meet Him; He wants to have a personal relationship with each of us and will do everything possible to bring this about. No one should remain in the darkness of error and ignorance, not enjoying the love of God, not experiencing divinity working in the human soul. Jesus, the divine Craftsman, wants to take us to His workbench and accomplish a complete work of transformation that He can and desires to do, depending on our decision. Will we let Him do it?

A few months after that first meeting, John became one of the twelve disciples who made up the group of Christ's apostles. Matthew 10:22. From then on, he followed Christ wherever He went and immersed himself in the work of learning from the divine Master, to the point where he became part of the small group of Christ's closest friends, along with Peter and James. It was a great privilege for John to receive from the divine Master the divine water welling up to eternal life. John 4:14. For more than three years, he walked with Christ and witnessed His life and work.

We, like John, may also join the school of Jesus. It is true that John was able to know the Master personally; but we may know Him through the sacred pages of the Bible, through prayer, and through the study of His created works. We can receive directly from His hand the water that quenches our thirst. Do we want that?

John and his character defects

John was not always the disciple of love, as we already said. When he met Christ and decided to follow Him, the Master called him, along with James, "Boanerges," meaning "son of thunder." Mark 3:17. John had a character that was very **impulsive** and **aggressive**; he was **critical**, **selfish**, **suspicious**, "quick to resent slight and **injury."** –The Sanctified Life, p. 54.

He argued heatedly with the other disciples about which of them would be the greatest or most important (Luke 9:46), which means that he also had feelings of grandeur and had put self on a pedestal.

He was **exclusive**. On one occasion, he reproved some who were working independently, that is, who didn't officially belong to the group of Christ's followers (Luke 9:49), which shows that he also had the Jewish thinking that God can only work with one class of people, to the exclusion of the rest.

He was **aggressive**, as evidenced by the passage in the gospels which told about Jesus and His disciples' visit to a Samaritan village to preach the gospel. When its inhabitants rejected Christ, John had the "bright" idea of

calling down fire from heaven to consume those people. Luke 9:52-56. Tremendous, John! He was a **rough**, **violent** man and needed a special power that would transform his life. That power, that force—dunamis—was in Christ, who wanted to transform him and the rest of His disciples.

Are we like John? Maybe proud? Do we tend to criticize others? Do we easily feel hurt by others? Are we aggressive, violent, and impulsive? ¿Libertine and selfish? No matter what we are, what matters is what Jesus can do for each of us. He has the power to transform lives. Will we let Him do that?

John and his transformation

The transformation John experienced did not take place overnight; it was a process. He voluntarily entered the school of Christ, as did the other disciples. What happens in this school is known as **sanctification**. Jesus was the **Teacher**; **and they, the students**. What Christ imparts has such depth that it can transform the students' lives, and His methods are unparalleled, for any student can graduate from the school with the best grades. Do we want to be students in Jesus' school?

However, a **student's attitude** is the main thing. While the instructor is speaking, some spend class time staring at the ceiling or thinking about the moon. They can spend years and learn nothing. Others, however, can absorb all kinds of material in a short time and know as much or more than the professor. There are **three basic conditions** for learning in the school of Christ and receiving the *dunamis* of the Spirit, and John knew and applied them to his life. Let us look at these three conditions or requirements, based on the Bible and Spirit of prophecy:

First requirement: Be ready to see one's own errors. "Who can understand his errors? cleanse Thou me from secret faults." Psalm 19:12. "Those who were ready to see their own defects ... had ample opportunity." —The Sanctified Life, p. 59. This is the first requirement—to acknowledge our sins. Proverbs 28:13. The natural heart cannot do this, but it is possible for the heart that is guided by the Spirit of God. When we see our sinful condition, the tremendous defects of our

characters, we have taken the first step toward the transformation of character, because only he who knows he is sick seeks a remedy for healing.

Second requirement: Have a keen desire to improve one's character. "As the hart panteth after the water brooks, so panteth my soul after Thee, O God." Psalm 42:1. "Those who were ... anxious to improve in character, had ample opportunity." -The Sanctified Life, p. 59. It is useless to acknowledge one's guilt and defects without taking the second step. Satan knows that he is living in rebellion, but he decided to continue in perpetual enmity against God. If we see our faults, let us ask the Lord to give us the desire to change, to truly repent, to be different, and to conform our characters to the image of the sweet Jesus. Philippians 2:13. Although Satan puts in our hearts the desire to sin, Jesus places in our minds the desire to live in holiness.

Third requirement: Take advantage of every *lesson that Christ teaches.* "Thy word have I hid in mine heart, that I might not sin against Thee." Psalm 119:11. "John treasured every lesson and constantly sought to bring his life into harmony with the Divine Pattern." – The Sanctified Life, p. 59. The third step involves conversion–living differently, rejecting evil, and taking one's experiences, both good and bad, and using them to grow in grace. Everything that happens to us is a lesson in the school of Christ. Experiences can be sweet or as bitter as gall, but they all contribute to our good if we learn from them. Peter denied his Master, even though he had said that he would not. Instead of sinking into depression and despair, he decided to repent and follow the beloved Jesus again, but with a different attitude. Part of genuine repentance is the change of one's life.

John and his testimony

By drinking from his beloved Master's fountain of wisdom, John obtained the highest education, and his character was transformed. We only have to read his letters to prove this. 1 John 4:4-11. From Boanerges he was converted into the beloved disciple, or the disciple of love. John 21:20. When Christ was arrested, John followed Him to the palace of the high priest and did not

mind being recognized as a follower who was considered seditious, in contrast to Peter, who tried to hide and wanted to go unnoticed. John stood by the cross, and Jesus entrusted to him the care of His mother. John 18:15; 19:26. When he heard that Christ's tomb was empty early Sunday morning, John ran to the tomb to verify the report and arrived before Peter. John 20:1-10. John saw the risen Christ and also saw Him ascend into the heavens with the promise to return. After the ascension, John and the other ten disciples remained in the upper room in Jerusalem, continuing in prayer together. Acts 1:13, 14. They received the dunamis-power-of the Holy Spirit in the early rain (Acts 2:1-4), which enabled them to preach the gospel with great power.



John experienced a genuine transformation. He devoted his life to studying Christ. He understood that character is the work of a lifetime, that we can have everything, but if we fail to imitate Christ, we will be the most miserable people and all that we possess will do us no good.

John was exiled to the Isle of Patmos for the purpose of silencing his voice, but there God revealed to him the world's most beautiful book—The Revelation of Jesus Christ. John was placed in a cauldron of boiling oil, but still he did not deny his Master and miraculously emerged unscathed from the test. He clung to Christ as one who clings to a rescuer at sea and achieved the victory.

Are we able to recognize God even in the worst circumstances of our lives? Can we, in difficult times, hear His voice and value what He has always done for us? John's life was a sweet fragrance and still today testifies of the power of the gospel.

Do we want to be transformed in this new year, like John, from Boanerges to disciples of love? Do we want our imperfections to be consumed by Christ on the altar of self-denial? Do we really want to be a new creature? May the Lord help us to imitate John in his faithfulness and example, and to be able to reflect the image of Jesus in our lives as John reflected Him, being transformed from Boanerges into disciples of love. God bless you.

he people who live the longest eat less and try to keep their bodies warm. Keeping warm means to stay healthy.

When one speaks of a dead body, he says it is cold. This helps us understand that disease and the aging process are a result of the body getting cold. Actually, cancer, stroke, Alzheimer's disease, and many other diseases that affect women are related to the body being cold.

Seventy percent of our bodies is water, so circulation of the blood is very important. Pain appears in any area that does not have good circulation. There is one of our organs where cancer never occurs. Do you know which one it is? It's the heart, because of its heat.

We often say that our feet are cold even in the summer. Our stomach is frequently cold. Because of the food we eat and our modern environment, the temperature of our body tends to be on the low side. There are air conditioners everywhere—in the office, in the car, in the stores, and at home. Sometimes we carry an extra jacket or sweater just to keep from feeling cold. Doctors and scientists say that a rise of 1 degree Centigrade causes the immune system to become five times stronger.

On the other hand, when one's body temperature goes down, the immune system weakens. When compared with just fifty years ago, the average person's temperature has dropped by 0.8 to 1 degree Centigrade. Some attribute an increase in disease to this. Therefore, when we warm up our bodies, we improve our circulation and help prevent disease.

How can you warm up?

- Drink warm water and tea instead of cold water
- Warm the lower part of your body in the bath or shower
- Exercise
- Eat foods that keep your body warm, such as honey combined with ginger, as well as onions, black beans, and pumpkins (which some people refer to as "longevity" foods)

May God help us all to take very good care of our bodies so we can truly be God's soldiers. **SW**

Staying warm and maintaining our body temperature helps our bodies defend against invasion of wind, cold, or viruses, because viruses thrive and replicate faster when our body temperature drops. When the body's temperature goes down even one degree, it is more vulnerable to developing a full-blown illness. If our temperature drops even further, it will cause us to shiver, and our teeth will chatter. When that happens, it is almost a guarantee that we're going to get sick, especially when combined with exposure to other elements, such as wind, rain, or snow. This makes sense when you look at one of the body's primary mechanisms for fighting off a virus—fever. Raising the body temperature even one degree helps it stop or slow the replication of a virus and simultaneously improves the function of our white blood cells. —See http://www.kidsloveacupuncture.com.

Greetings to you all with the message about the Waldensian missionaries: "The Vaudois ministers were trained as missionaries, everyone who expected to enter the ministry being required first to gain an experience as an evangelist. Each was to serve three years in some mission field before taking charge of a church at home. This service, requiring at the outset self-denial and sacrifice, was a fitting introduction to the pastor's life in those times that tried men's souls. The vouth who received ordination to the sacred office saw before them. not the prospect of earthly wealth and glory, but a life of toil and danger, and possibly a martyr's fate. The missionaries went out two and two, as Jesus sent forth His disciples. With every young man was usually associated a man of age and experience, the youth being under the guidance of his companion, who was held responsible for his training, and whose instruction he was required to heed. These co-laborers were not always together, but often met for prayer and counsel, thus strengthening each other in the faith." –The Great Controversy, pp. 70, 71.

In view of the approaching climax of the great controversy between the Prince of Peace and His agents on one side and the prince of darkness and his agents on the other side, the church of God has a great duty to train competent warriors as did our Master, who went

"... up into a mountain, and calleth unto Him whom He would: and they came unto Him. And He ordained twelve, that they should be with Him, and that He might send them forth to preach." Mark 3:13, 14."




